We are honored to present the YMCA of Greater Toronto with this proposal for your review and input. Together and with our partner, First Nations University of Canada, we propose to deliver a transformational and measurable shift in your workplace culture to amplify your commitment to working with Indigenous peoples and meeting the **TRC Calls to Action in the workplace**.

For your consideration, this proposal outlines a quote and proposed pathway for the implementation of a workplace online course for your employees ready this spring-summer, in time for **Indigenous History Month in June**.

We invite you to review our presentation to provide reconciliation education training which would specifically support your commitment to diversity, equity and inclusion, while assisting you in meeting the Calls to Actions from the Truth and Reconciliation Commission in your organization. In advance of **your training start of spring-summer 2022**, we propose to provide you with a customized course in both official languages compliant with digital accessibility requirements which can be delivered on your learning portal or ours. Your customized course could also include words of welcome from your leadership, (if you wish) and other additions to help your employees feel they are learning within their own workplace, amongst each other. We would include more **focus on Ontario content**.

The online course is 2h30 - 3h in length with **a certificate of completion provided by First Nations University of Canada**. In addition to the course, employees can access or host team discussions with the bonus library featuring an additional ten hours+ including our award-winning reconciliation film series. These short videos can also be embedded in your diversity newsletters or campaigns for your team to signify important calendar events or amplify in-person training and learning or celebrate specific D&I events.

This proposal provides you and your team with two programs of direct reciprocity to Indigenous communities. The first, reflects the value of education for Indigenous youth with 10% of your purchase being directly donated to scholarships to First Nations University students from across Canada (including Ontario). The second reflects the value of co-learning and sharing access to knowledge by donating this learning resource to an Indigenous organization, or Indigenous stakeholders of your choice, on your behalf.

This course was piloted in **Whitecap Dakota Nation** to ensure it meets the needs of Indigenous learners in the workplace as well as other learners. It is also the course of choice for **LinkedIn, Deloitte, Sodexo, RBC, CIBC, BMO and federal, provincial and municipal governments** along with others in the post-secondary and secondary sector across 10 provinces. The first version was published for the education sector in 2014 for the national Aboriginal Healing Foundation. 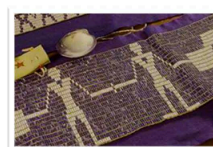

The course is in 10 provinces in French and English and has been vetted by Indigenous Leads from across the country as well as Diversity and Inclusion review teams in over 130+ organizations to close to 300,000 learners.

About the workplace course: *4 Seasons of Reconciliation* provides a comprehensive online learning course with captivating multi-media components, including award-winning reconciliation documentaries. Each short module can be completed at the learner's pace and provides a mix of learning tools such as PowerPoint, videos, award-winning films, and quizzes. A certificate of completion and a bonus video library for on-going learning is provided at the end of the course. The course provides the foundational awareness and learning of truth and reconciliation and the completion certificate is provided by First Nations University of Canada. 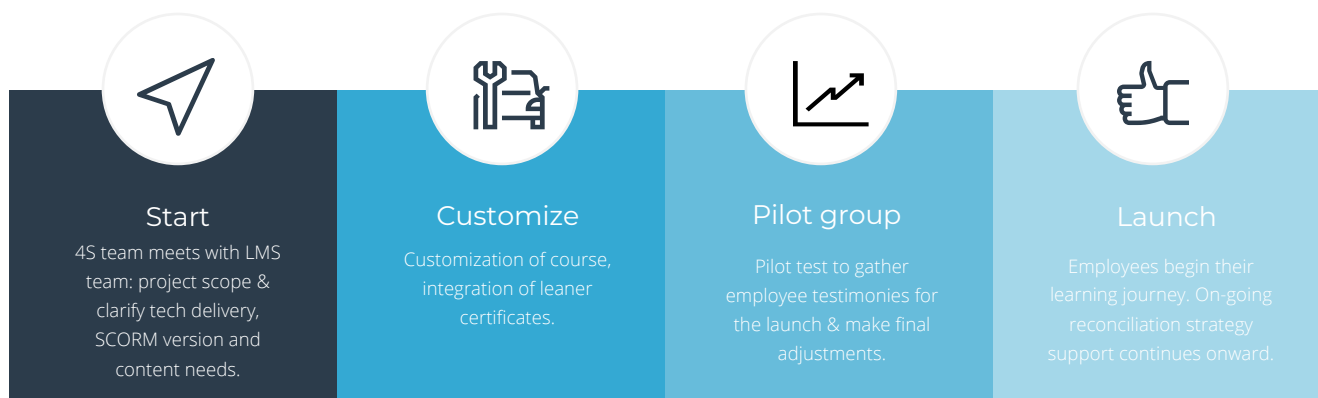

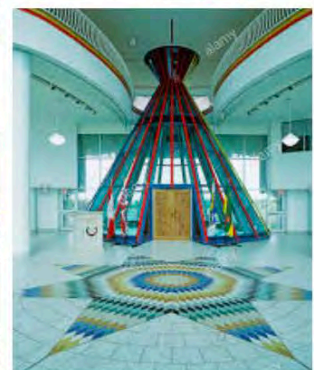

First Nations University of Canada, established in 1976, is the first First Nations controlled university in Canada and a leader in Indigenous-based education. Located in Saskatchewan, FNU is a unique Canadian institution that specializes in Indigenous knowledge, providing post-secondary education for Indigenous and non-Indigenous students alike within a culturally supportive environment.

In spring 2019, it received 'reserve land status' around its campus area in Regina and is the first University to be bestowed indigenous-land status.



The First Nations University of Canada partnered with Productions Cazabon's for the past five years in the co-creation of multi-media education tools for the award-winning film series and courses with the project: '**4 Seasons of Reconciliation**'.

Our first film in the series, ***Economic Reconciliation***, written by Anishnaabe author, Maurice Switzer, premiered at the former Toronto Stock Exchange on October 16, 2018 for the private sector, featuring prominent Indigenous business leaders in the film and panel.

Our second documentary, '**Douglas Cardinal - Architect of the Future**' is featured daily at the Venice Biennale and at the Museum of History, as part of the *Unceded* international exhibition.

Waniska - An Awakening of Indigenous Knowledge was directed by the Elder's Circle at First Nations University and was released in 2018 to several film festivals in the US, India, New Zealand and Canada.

Asonamatowin - A Sharing of Indigenous Knowledge, released in fall 2019, is the sequel to the film 'Waniska', directed by the same Elders. It, too, has won film festival awards.



About Productions Cazabon

Proudly based in Regina, Productions Cazabon is the producer of the educational online learning site '*4 Seasons of Reconciliation*' and its 4-part film series on reconciliation, in partnership with First Nations University of Canada.

The social enterprise has built a reputation over the past decade for respectful co-creation and honouring Indigenous leadership and voices during its commitment to working full-time on reconciliation (since 2007). This process and relational approach continues with the work of '*4 Seasons of Reconciliation*', now in six provinces in the workplace and in the classroom.

During its 10+ year commitment to reconciliation, the team has volunteered its production services and worked with the Truth and Reconciliation Commission, the Legacy of Hope, the Aboriginal Healing Foundation, the Assembly of First Nations and the Caring Society, along with a number of remote First Nations communities, to help advance their initiatives.

In 2014, Production Cazabon was approached by the Lieutenant Governor of Ontario to project-manage, the first-ever Royal overnight visit in an Indigenous community. The Countess of Wessex, accompanied by eight Canadian women leaders, participated in a remote reconciliation trip. Led by the Indigenous youth leaders, Productions Cazabon co-facilitated four annual reconciliation trips attended by every-day Canadians and public figures. These trips brought over 153 guests, from all ages and walks of life, to be hosted in the homes and to learn directly from the remote Nation of Kitchenuhmaykoosib Inninuwug.

For the past five years, Productions Cazabon collaborates with the First Nations University of Canada on reconciliation projects, multi-media education tools and films.

For its online course portals and film series, production and post-production equipment have been updated to the latest 4K video quality standard (above tv broadcast standards) with ongoing investments in digital accessibility solutions.

Andrée Cazabon - CEO, Executive Producer

As a Gemini nominee, Andrée Cazabon's films have amassed over 1 million viewers on CBC - Newsworld, TVA, Canal D, Radio-Canada, and CBC Television. A member of the Academy of Canadian Cinema & Television and Documentary Organization of Canada, she is the founder and CEO of Productions Cazabon, an award-winning bilingual film and television production company based in Regina, Saskatchewan, with a satellite office in Toronto.

Saskatchewan Kehte-Ayak First-Nations University's Elders and Residential Schools Survivors

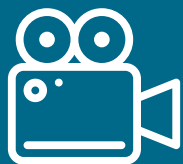

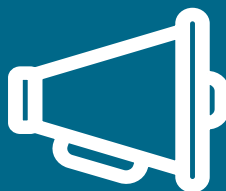
